## Seventy-Five Years of Academic Excellence: Commemorating the Legacy and Future Vision of the Pakistan Armed Forces Medical Journal (PAFMJ)

Distinguished founding members and senior contributors, including **Prof Mahmud Ahmed Akhter** (Prof Emeritus Ex Surg Gen Pak Army), **Prof Muhammad Aslam** (Vice Chancellor City University Islamambad and IMDC Islamabad) Mr Shaukat Ali Jawaid (Chief Editor Pakistan Journal of Medical Sciences Karachi), and Prof Akhter Shireen (Chief Editor KMUJ Peshawar) shared reflective insights on the journal's early vision, formative years, and sustained progress over seven and a half decades.
